Witnesses, friends, family, neighbors, politicians, and religious figures tell their fragments of the event; exposing their own biases and limited points of view. Powerful emotional authenticity pulls the reader through this quick read. Just as in real life, there is no resolution, just the opportunity to bear witness to the cycle of urban violence and to discuss the questions raised.
