Synopsis:

Sixth-grade Alton has very few friends, unless you count maps as friends. He doesn't just love maps of places and geocaching; but he also has an obsession of making maps of people's behaviors. For example, he created a map of how many times the principal says "um" during morning announcements or a map of the heights of sixth graders; referring to the tallest girl as Mount Wilson. Unfortunately, one day his coveted maps go missing. This terrifies Alton, thinking it highly embarrassing if his maps were to be discovered by the very people's behavior he mapped. Alton gets the courage to befriend one of the most popular boys to help him find the maps. When Alton receives mysterious, anonymous notes referring to his missing maps, Alton gets suspicious that his maps were stolen. So, he takes it upon himself to confess to his teachers and peers the content of these highly personal maps . . . this comes with surprising consequences.

- Use *Google Earth* to locate your house
- Ask if the students what the letters in GPS stand for and if any of the students had heard of geocaching, explain how it works (reference in book pages 26/27)
